## Cleveland Metro Ski Council took 22 members to St Anton, Austria in January 2019.

On January 11, 2019 a group of 22 CMSC members traveled across the Atlantic to do some skiing in St Anton, Austria, the birthplace of modern skiing. Right after we arrived a major snowstorm hit St Anton dumping several feet of snow the first day and a few more the second day. This made the avalanche level high causing many parts of the mountain to close. What remained open had epic conditions and on Tuesday many parts of the slopes started opening with great conditions. During those first two days we had so much snow and wind that we had very low visibility, but that didn't stop several die-hard skiers in our group to go out and ski from 9 to 4.

On Monday several of us planned on taking the train on a 1 ½ hour train ride to Liechtenstein but due to an avalanche our train was not allowed to leave the station. On Tuesday several people decided to go to Innsbruck for the day via train ride but that too was canceled since we were isolated due to both roads and train tracks being closed. This did not worry us or dampen the enjoyment since we were surrounded by great snow.

Monday night before dinner we had a group picture with the owner of our hotel Karl Schranz, a former champion alpine ski racer from Austria, one of the best of the 1960s and early 1970s. He won a silver medal in giant slalom in 1964 at Innsbruck.

Tuesday the sun came out and so did the rest of our skiers chomping at the bit to get out and ski the fresh snow. Tuesday after skiing many of us stopped at Mooser (Mooserwirt) known as the best Après ski bar in all St Anton.

Wednesday even got better as many more places were open to skiing and we took advantage of that. After skiing about 10 of us stopped at the Underground, another great après ski bar where we partied with several great people from Great Britain and Ireland. Partying with Brits is always a great time, and this was no exception.

After the great week of skiing about half of the group had to head to home while the rest of us went on to Paris for 4 days of sightseeing and enjoying the magic the city has to offer. We were happy to find out that the riots Paris had before we got there didn't affect us at all nor did it affect the charm of the city and its people. During our stay we had a sunny day followed by a little rain and the city received a few inches of snow letting us see the city in white. We really saw snow in Versailles which painted the landscape in white when it had received 4 or 5 inches of snow. We enjoyed great meals and wine while in Paris making this a very enjoyable add on in Paris.

In conclusion this trip to St Anton followed by 4 days in Paris was a great experience and once again reminded me and a few others how magical Europe truly is.

I must have first met Sue Stewart at a Ski West Ski Club meeting in the early 1980s, but the “first” memory I have is attending a CMSC meeting at the old Peninsula Nite Club as a delegate for Ski West and Sue was presiding.

I don’t know when Sue joined her first ski club, but join she did which lead to a lifetime of involvement--from helping on committees and events (like Glockenspiel and Superstars) to being secretary of CMSC and eventually president, not to mention her activities in Fagowees and Ski West (she was president). Regardless of what she did, Sue was always there to lend a hand, listen and encourage. CMSC was better because of Sue’s involvement.

As president, she saw the need for and created the first CMSC Race Committee, ran the Wednesday Night Race Series for a number of years, and, under the name “Erma” wrote about our weekend races for the Sitzmark. CMSC racing—on weekends and Wednesdays -- remains the heartbeat of CMSC.

There is one intrinsic talent Sue possessed and that was the ability to recognize the true potential in others and encourage them to achieve that potential. She got you to volunteer for things you never thought you could do, and you were the better for it.

It is no wonder that she became active in the Near West Theatre, as its mission of strengthening one’s sense of identity and purpose through theatre was compatible with her compassion for others. She held different positions there, but what she liked most about NWT was the positive impact it had on its participants—both onstage and off. Much like the impact Sue had on all who knew her.

A few summers ago, I spent a Sunday afternoon with Sue. We toured her Ohio City neighborhood on our bikes, stopping at the community garden she shared and I got to see how much she was liked by her fellow gardeners. Winding our way to Edgewater Park, I heard “Hi, Sue” multiple times. She was truly liked by the diverse residents of her neighborhood.

The last time I saw Sue was August 23, 2019. We had a great time watching the Cleveland Indians at Progressive Field. We hugged each other goodbye near the Bob Feller statue, she turned toward Carnegie to begin her walk home, and I in the opposite direction to my car. It was a great evening and the memory of it is one I will cherish.

Sue passed away suddenly on September 18, 2019, leaving behind a loving family and many, many friends.

# 2019 Metro Cup

## July 20, 2019



How hot was it? 94 degrees with humidity. That's what 82 golfers started with on Saturday, July 20, 2019, the 18<sup>th</sup> annual CMSC Metro Cup golf outing at Punderson golf course. Unlike years past when we waited for last minute arrivals, we started a few minutes early! Beaver Valley, Continental, Fagowees, and Hi Rise entered three full teams in quest of the Metro Cup team trophy and the Metro Cup scramble trophy. After 5 grueling hours, we all gathered at the Punderson Lodge and Manor banquet room to dine before celebrating the results.

The rules we have for scoring may seem complex. Eric Fischer and his math advisor figured it out. By positioning extra men and women players in the Medal events, the Fagowees maximized the number of points per player. By only entering one 4 person scramble, the maximum individual points only went to the one best foursome per team. The only event that originally started with two or more entrants was Women's Medal. Unfortunately, a late cancellation due to health issues changed that, so only the one best score per team counted for full points in all events. It may seem complicated; the rules have evolved over the years to equalize the chances of smaller clubs to win. Ironically, if it had not been for that cancellation in Women's Medal, there would have been a first time win for team Fagowees.

I don't know how Eric Fischer was able to convince 6 women and 7 men to play medalist instead of 2 or 4 person teams. The saying, "there is no I in team" was true for the 2019 Fagowees team. Congratulations! If not for fate in the way of one cancellation, you would have won the day! In 4<sup>th</sup> place was Jen Williams. Instead of one point, with two players per event, she would have gotten 10 points giving the Metro Cup to the Fagowees. Oh well, there is next year. It would be nice to see a club other than Continental or Hi Rise on the trophy.

There was a delay getting information out this year. Due to management changes at Punderson Lodge and Manor, we did not get a contract until April. Combine that with web site issues, we were more than happy with the turnout of 82 golfers! Thank goodness we have a core of dedicated competitors.

Our golf committee of Joe Mazie, Guy Nerren, Larry Crookshanks, Jessie Anderson, and Yvonne Daycak, with the help of Lindsay Crookshanks, John Seidel, and Dave Stark made a smooth running event! I hear that Eric Fischer will join us next year. **Save the date: July 18, 2020.**

We have been fortunate to have a group of players from Beaver Valley who have been regular participants and they won the first 4 person scramble trophy. This year we were able to get some cabins reserved for them in hopes of them bringing a full team next year. 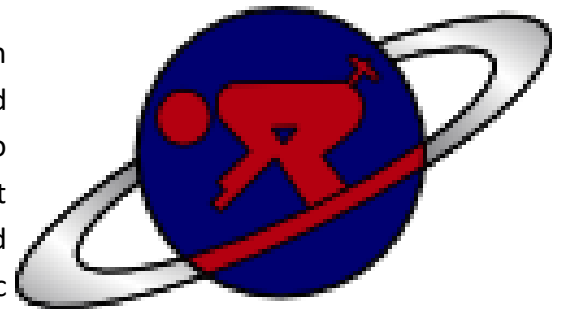

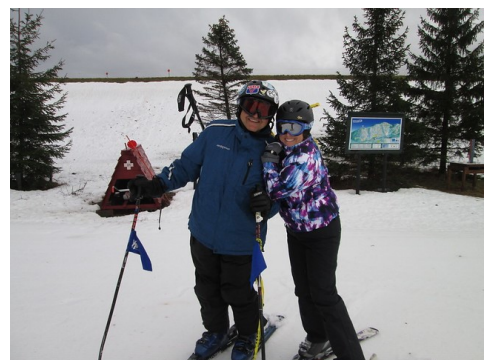
