**Madonna di Campiglio, Italy January 21-29, 2023**

**with optional add on to Malta Jan. 29 - Feb. 2, 2023**

In January 2023 Cleveland Metro Ski Council is visiting Madonna di Campiglio in the Dolomites Mountain of Northern Italy. The biggest ski area in Trentino is located right in the heart of the Brenta Dolomites. The Skiarea Campiglio Dolomiti di Brenta Val di Sole Val Rendena offers endless opportunities for fun and exciting skiing adventures. Around 100 miles of slopes that are always perfectly groomed with great snow conditions throughout the season and 60 lifts that link Val di Sole to Val Rendena giving skiers the chance to ski in the three most popular and top-rated ski areas: Folgarida Marilleva, Madonna di Campiglio and Pinzolo. With a



single ski pass you'll enjoy unforgettable experiences on the snow!



Skiing in Madonna di Campiglio. The vast ski area of Madonna di Campiglio means there is something for everyone. Beginners and intermediates can enjoy long blues. For advanced intermediates and experts, there are numerous blacks as well as off-piste areas and racing runs. The long sweeping black slope, Spinale Direttissima, is perfect for those wanting a challenge. Cross-country routes and night-skiing are also available in this resort.

We will be staying at the Hotel St. Raphael, a 4-star hotel. All the rooms and suites in Hotel San Raphael are modern and very comfortable, and designed in typical Tyrolean style. Most rooms have balconies with superb views of the valley and surrounding peaks.



The add-on option to Malta, Jan. 29 - Feb. 2, 2023, is a beautiful Island nation between Sicily and North Africa. Malta is filled with beautiful churches, historical sights like ancient ruins and WWII sights to name a few. The island has had a lot of movies filmed there due to the many natural wonders on the island. The island also has great places to eat and a fun nightlife. We will be staying at the Hotel Waterfront located very close to the shoreline.



## Banff Canada March 4-11, 2023

Cleveland Metro Ski Council will be going to western Canada March 4th for a week of skiing around Banff, Canada. We will be staying in their superior rooms at Ptarmigan Lodge and 4-star hotel. Complimentary amenities include a hot breakfast buffet and underground parking. There's also a bar/lounge, and an informal restaurant offering Italian food. The hotel has 2 hot tubs, a steam room and a sauna, plus ski storage and bike rentals in summer. The hotel provides a free bus pass for which includes going to the ski areas. Downtown is a couple minute walk or take bus if you don't wish to walk.

The four ski resorts near Banff each have their own look, feel, and vibe, so be sure to plan a visit to at least a couple of them. Banff Sunshine Village Resort is up high above the tree line with incredible vistas; Lake Louise is set more among the trees, with the Fairmont Chateau Lake Louise standing proudly across the valley; Norquay is a local's mountain with great facilities and non-existent lift lines; and Nakiska is ideal for the intermediate looking to advance.

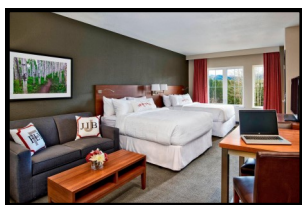

Breckenridge has a vertical of 3,398 feet.

# LEWIS SKI CLUB

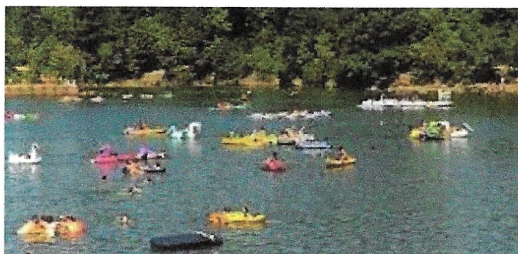
***We're Getting Out There!*** – In between ski seasons, the Lewis Ski Club continues to get outside with year-round activities. We've already hit the bike trails twice...



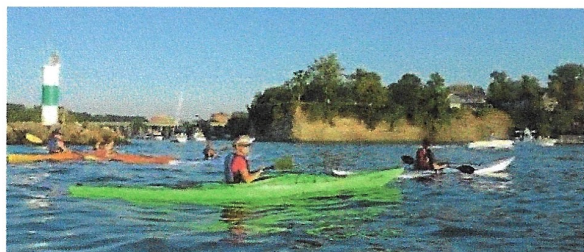
***Bicycling in the Flats***

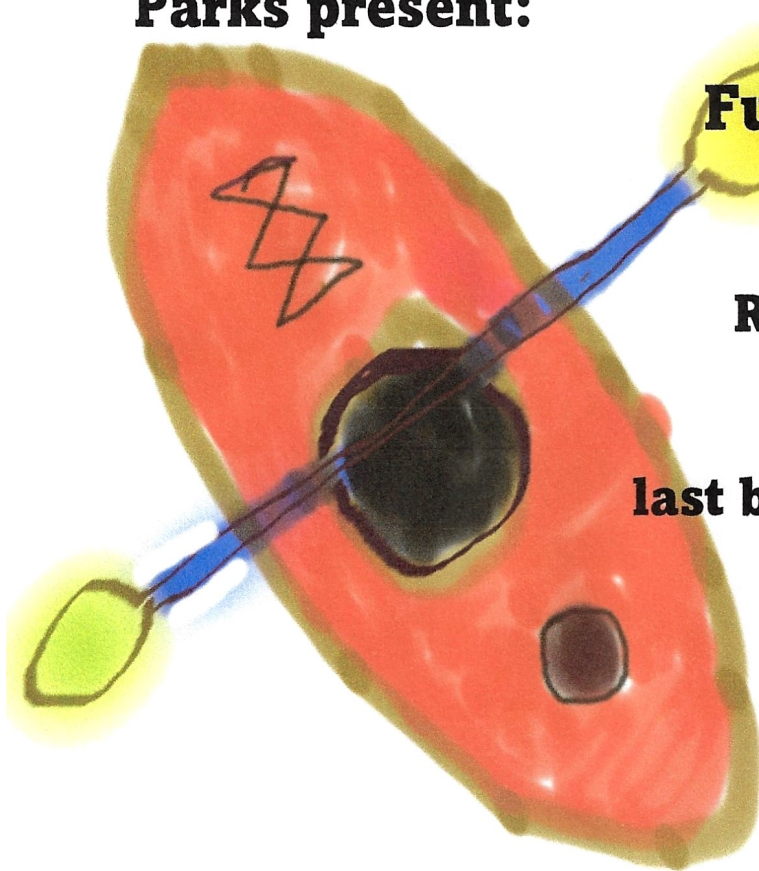

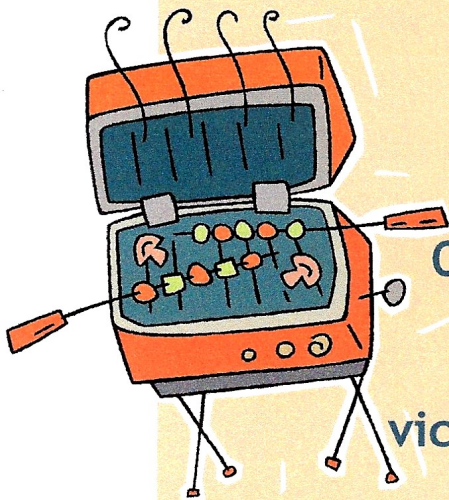


