IT IS NOT TOO LATE TO JOIN US! On January 21, 2023 Cleveland Metro Ski Council will be taking 28 skiers to Madonna di Campiglio in the Dolomites Mountains of Northern Italy.

In 2018 when CMSC went to Madonna di Campiglio for a week many members who have been going on several European trips said this was their favorite place in Europe to ski. The town of Madonna di Campiglio is a small, but not too small of a town surrounded by mountains that you will be skiing on.

Madonna di Campiglio is in the middle of the biggest ski area in Trentino which is located right in the heart of the Brenta Dolomites.

The Skiarea Campiglio Dolomiti di Brenta Val di

Sole Val Rendena offers endless opportunities for fun and exciting skiing adventures. Around 100 miles of slopes that are always perfectly groomed with great snow conditions throughout the season and 60 lifts that link Val di Sole to Val Rendena giving skiers the chance to ski in the three most popular and top-rated ski areas: Folgarida Marilleva, Madonna di Campiglio and Pinzolo. With a single ski pass you'll enjoy unforgettable experiences on the snow!

Skiing in Madonna di Campiglio. The vast ski area of Madonna di Campiglio means there is something for everyone. Beginners and intermediates can enjoy long blues. For advanced intermediates and experts, there are numerous blacks as well as off-piste areas and racing runs. The long sweeping black slope, Spinale Direttissima, is perfect for those wanting a challenge. Cross-country routes and night-skiing are also available in this resort.



We will be staying at the Hotel St. Raphael, a 4-star hotel. All the rooms and suites in Hotel San Raphael are modern and very comfortable and designed in typical Tyrolean style. Most rooms have balconies with superb views of the valley and surrounding peaks.

We will then have 20 people go on the add-on portion of the trip to Malta, Jan. 29 - Feb. 2, 2023, which is a beautiful island nation between Sicily and North Africa. Malta is filled with beautiful churches and sites like ancient ruins and historical WWII sights to name a

Cleveland Metro Ski Council is going to Banff Canada for the week of March 4-11, 2023. We will be staying at Ptarmigan Lodge and 4-star hotel in their superior rooms. This trip includes a hot breakfast buffet each morning. There's also a bar/lounge, and a restaurant offering Italian food. The hotel has 2 hot tubs, a steam room and a sauna, plus ski storage. The hotel provides a free bus pass for which includes going to the ski areas. You can take a short walk to the downtown section of Banff that is filled with restaurants and bars.



In the town of Banff you'll find a wonderful main street just perfect for strolling after a fun day on the slopes. Banff also has a good selection of restaurants, ranging from casual fare right through to white tablecloth fine dining. The town also a great night life and great place for shopping.

The four ski resorts near Banff each have their own look, feel, and vibe, so be sure to plan a visit to at least a couple of them. 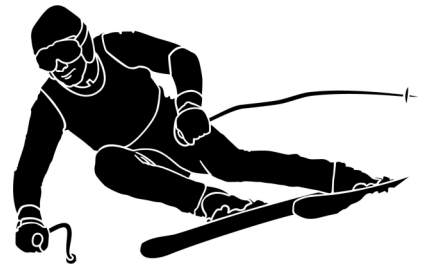

Hello Racers and Race Chairs!

I hope that you've all been enjoying your summer. The race committee has been hard at work since the end of the race season, and we have an announcement that we'd like to make.

We are re-aligning the ski racing classes.

Ok, now that you've come to after possibly fainting and/or falling out of your chair, let me explain why we've decided to do this.

- The current class setup was created when we had a much larger group of racers. Sadly, thanks to Father Time and a host of other factors, we now average only about 85 - 100 racers at each race.
- Some classes only have one or two people show up on a regular basis; other classes routinely have 7+ racers attend. And at times, within classes, the spread is so large top to bottom, that many racers simply have little shot at truly competing! Our goal is to balance out the numbers per class, while also making the spread within each class more competitive (this is key!).

In recent years, with many more racers in group 1 than in group 2, it has created a nightmare when doing work assignments.

I'm sure that you're wondering how we re-aligned the classes. At the end of the race season last year, we started discussing how to achieve this and a sub-committee was created and given the task of: 1. Reducing the overall number of ski race classes and 2. Making those classes more competitive.

The sub-committee spent June, July and August developing two options to present to the race committee. If I had to guess, we spent well over 30 hours on data analysis and discussion in developing the options that were presented to the entire race committee. What I'm trying to say is, we didn't take this decision to re-align the classes lightly.

The description below is the option that the race committee voted on and approved effective for the 2023 race season:

- We will have 15 ski classes; 7 men's classes, 5 women's classes and 3 co-ed classes
- There are two veteran classes: Super Senior Vet and Senior Vet (these are co-ed, as they have been in the past)

The third co-ed class that is mentioned in the first bullet point is the Open Elite Class; this is a class for our fastest racers (both male and female)

When we analyzed the data, we removed names, classes and clubs to look strictly at times to present our options to the committee. Over the next few weeks, the committee will send out the new class structure to each of the race chairs to share with their teams.

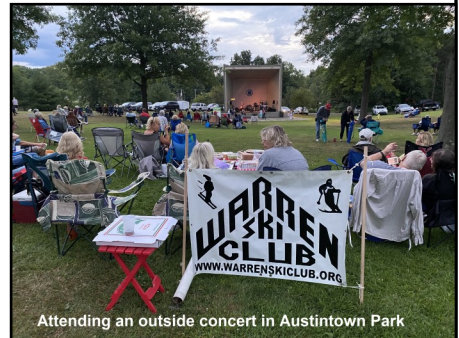

Suburban Ski Club

Last year, faced with the high transmissibility of the Delta and Omicron variants, Suburban Ski Club made a bold move by adopting our COVID-19 vaccination policy. At the time, we required mask wearing and proof of vaccination for participation in all club activities. Many of our members welcomed the extra precautions, but some others considered it to be too restrictive.

As the virus continues to evolve, we have relaxed the policy for this year. The pandemic is still with us, and its future remains unpredictable. We believe vaccination and masking still provide the best protection against transmission, and we highly recommend both. However, we do not currently require masking or proof of vaccination to participate in club activities.

We are planning three major trips this year. All three are to resorts that honor Ikon passes, which allows pass holders to save on lift ticket prices. All three trips are currently sold out, but you can contact the trip leaders for waiting list info. See our web site for contact information.

The first week-long trip will be to Steamboat, CO January 21-28, 2023. We will stay at the Ski Inn Condominiums located just off the slopes via an access trail or short shuttle ride.

For our eastern trip we will return to Killington and its sister resort Pico Mountain in Vermont, with a day at Okemo. This trip will be

February 12-18. Like our other recent trips to New England, this will be a bargain-priced, all-inclusive package with bus transportation, lodging, five days of skiing, daily hot breakfasts, and dinners. We have had to raise the price for this trip to \$1550, which is higher than past eastern trips but still much lower than our other trips, especially when you consider that meals are included. We will stay in the Killington Mountain Lodge. Travel will be by charter bus and will include our legendary on-board breakfasts, box lunches and snacks. Many members have come to prefer these bus trips over the hassles of air travel.

Our third major trip will be to Sun Valley, ID, March 11-18. We will stay at the Limelight Ketchum Hotel, which offers daily breakfasts and a free shuttle to the resort.

In addition, we will have five one-day bus trips to Holiday Valley and Holimont. The Holiday Valley trips will be on Fridays, January 6, January 13, February 3, and February 24. The Holimont trip is on Tuesday, February 7. The first three Holiday Valley trips will allow apres-ski time in Ellicottville for skiers to dine and/or shop. The last one will include a dinner stop at Grand River Cellars in Madison, OH. For the Holimont trip, we are planning an apres-ski chili party. Members can make reservations for one-day trips online and pay with a credit card, or print out a flyer to mail in with a check.

Meetings will also resume in the fall in our usual location, Alfredo's at the Holiday Inn just off Wilson Mills Road at I-271. Meetings start at 7:00 p.m. Many of us arrive early for dinner at Alfredo's restaurant. Meetings will be on Thursdays, September 15, October 20, November 10, January 12, February 9, and March 9. We also typically have one or more social activities each month.

Dues are just \$20 per person, and first-time members get a special price of only \$10. Membership forms can be printed from our web site and mailed in, or the application can be completed online and paid with a credit card or PayPal account.

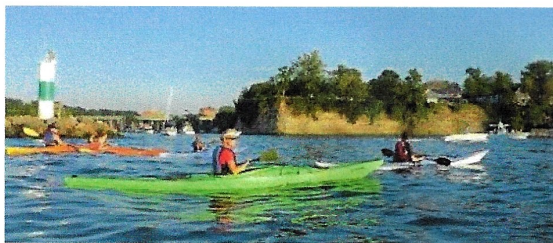

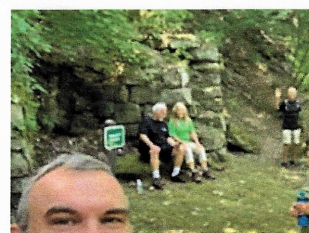

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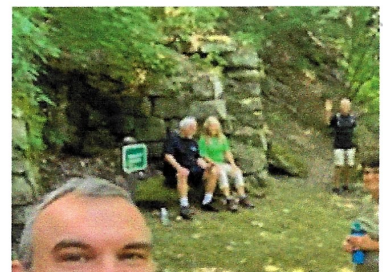
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
